Topics I have covered in Collective Worship are:

- Tolerance the first week we looked at how we interact with people who are different to us. In the second week we looked at how we may see things differently and how we accept people having different views.

- Wisdom and looking at King Solomon asking God for Wisdom.


Toast Club
