We had an autumn leaf craft and they looked great. Again, we finish our sessions with a prayer and the group asked to do the closing prayer which I love as it shows that it is their group but also gives them a chance to lead a prayer.

Our group has seen a couple of new members and the activities we have done so far have gone down really well with a free night to start of just catching up, Archery and Chocolate fudge making as you can see from the pictures, they just couldn't wait to get stuck in.





May Camp
