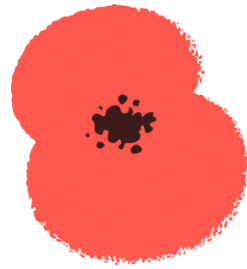


Remembrance Sunday 2021
